As administrator of Home Education Partnership of Texas, I am so glad that you will be joining us for Prom. It is going to be a very memorable occasion with door prizes, a wonderful DJ, great lights, amazing music, and dinner provided. In preparation for this special event, I would like to make you aware of a few important guidelines regarding the evening.

Safety Rules:

There are several safety rules that we will be abiding for the 2015 HEP Prom. When you arrive at Golfrest Country Club, you are not allowed to leave until the end of the event. You are not allowed to go to the parking lot or to your car during the evening. You will be signed in when you arrive and signed out when you leave at the end of the night. If you need to leave early, your parents must make those arrangements with the chaperones or me when you arrive and your parents must pick you up and check you out. If you drive yourself to the event and leave early, your parents will be notified by phone of your departure. There is a zero tolerance policy with regards to alcohol and drug use before or during this event. Adult chaperones and HEP employees will be present all evening to help enforce these rules.

Dress Code:

Our theme for this Prom is THE LAST WALTZ with city and skyline decorations. We have a dress code for classes at HEP and we have a dress code for this social function as well. It is a formal even, so gentlemen and ladies should wear formal attire.

If you arrive at Prom and it is deemed that your attire does not follow the dress code, you may be asked to go home and change, so please do not violate dress code.

Gentlemen: Formal dress for this event means you should wear either a tuxedo or a suit coat and pants with a dress shirt, dress shoes, socks, and a tie.

Ladies: Formal dress for this event means you should wear a long dress. No short dresses!

Dresses must not have side cutouts, sheer or transparent panels, be completely backless or have a bare midriff. All dresses must not have slits higher than two inches above the top of the knee. You may wear a high low dress that is short in the front and long in the back if the front of the dress is no shorter than two inches above the top of the knee.

It is your responsibility as a student of HEP or a home schooled student to pass this dress code information to your dates and any guests that you invite. We hope these guidelines help you to plan your dress appropriately for this event.
